- i. Reject: 1 record with drop before first meeting and contact hours

- iii. All credit FTES*: 5,453 (winter 2016: 5,718; decline of 5%)

b. Foothill (*student headcount and FTES figures are underestimated due to the significant number of rejected records*)

- i. Rejects:
 1. 1,626 records missing final grade (deleted to pass quality edits)
 - a. 93 sections missing 100% grades; 80 (82%) of these are sections with class date in spring or summer 2017.
 - b. 17 sections with 100% missing grades and at least 30 since last date of class. (See below section count by department. Date of query: June 2, 2017).
