Re: MIS SP (Academic Awards) Submission Report, 2019-20

### Summary

The 2019-20 MIS SP (Student Academic Programs) report for the FHDA CCD (Foothill-De Anza Community College District) was submitted to the CCCO (California Community colleges Chancellor's Office) on October 2, 2020. With the purpose of providing data custodians with the opportunity or reviewing the data submitted, this document provides the following:

- Academic award counts for each college for the last three academic years
  (2017-18, 2018-19, and 2019-20). These data are shown in Tables 1.D (D,
  De Anza College) and Table 1.F (F, Foothill College); they include any award
  submitted in the latest MIS SP report to the CCCCO for the academic year.
- Headcounts by highest academic award granted to each student at the
  college during the academic year. Data in Table 2.D and Table 2.F show
  unduplicated counts for only the highest academic award for each student
  during the academic year at the college is included. In these tables, academic
  awards are ranked from the highest to lowest academic level: baccalaureate;
  associate degree for transfer; associate degree; credit certificate, SCFF
  (applicable to SCFF, Student Centered Funding Formula, funding); credit
  certificate, Not SCFF (not applicable to SCFF funding); and noncredit
  certificate.
- Student headcounts by SCFF award ranking and academic year. Data in
  Table 3.D and Table 3.F only include awards applicable to SCFF funding and
  students who were registered at the District (Foothill College or De Anza
  College) during the academic year they received the award—FHDA

registered, as shown in the MIS SX (enrollment) report. Only the highest SCFF award received by the student at the college during the academic year is included. For SCFF, academic awards are ranked from highest to lowest SCFF: associate degree for transfer; associate degree; baccalaureate degree; and credit certificate, SCFF. Award ranking is based on procedures described in the CCCCO SCFF FY 2019-20 Metric Definitions (Student Success Allocation Metrics, <a href="https://www.cccco.edu/About-Us/Chancellors-Office/Divisions/College-Finance-and-Facilities-Planning/Student-Centered-Funding-Formula">https://www.cccco.edu/About-Us/Chancellors-Office/Divisions/College-Finance-and-Facilities-Planning/Student-Centered-Funding-Formula</a>).

 SCFF points by academic award and academic year. Data in Table 4.D and Table 4.F show "Student Success Points" (all students) based on SCFF procedures (highest SCFF award received by students at the college during the academic year; only students registered at the District during the academic year they received the awards are included). Student success points and academic award ranking are shown below.

• FHDA CCD SCFF student success points by college, academic award, and academic year. Data in Table 5.1 shows points contributed by each college to the District's total, including data for three-year average and changes for the last two academic years (count change and percentage change) by academic award. Data in Table 5.2 show the college contribution as a percentage of the total for the District. With the purpose of evaluating the extent to which SCFF points may be "lost" because of student FHDA registration status (i.e., granting the academic award during an academic year in which the student was no longer registered at either college), data in Table 5.3 shows count and percentage points by student FHDA registration status by college and academic year.

Student headcounts by program code and title (Banner code and descriptor for each program) by academic year for each college are available at the FHDA IRP MIS SP website
 (http://research.fhda.edu/mis\_reports/mis\_sp\_program\_awards/). Data are provided in an Excel file to allow data custodians and managers at each college an in-depth review of the data, including the performance of vocational/CTE (career technical education) programs (TOP code and its vocational status are also provided).


# Data Highlights

- Data in Table 5.1 show that SCFF student success points for the FHDA
   CCD have been declining during the last three academic years. In the last
   two academic years (2018-19 and 2019-20), the data show a 7% decline
   (9,525 in 2019-20 from 10,180 in 2018-19). Two major factors contributing
   to this decline include a significant drop for:
  - Number of students awarded at least one degree (ADT, AA, AS) at De Anza College between the last two years (-9% or 150 less: 1,546 in 2019-20 from 1,696 in 2018-19); and
  - Number of students awarded a credit certificate applicable to SCFF funding at Foothill College (-120% or 306 less; 154 in 2019-20 from 255 in 2018-19).
- Data in Table 5.2 show that during for the last three academic years, De
  Anza College has accounted for about 60% of the total SCFF student
  success points allocated to the District, while Foothill College has accounted
  for about 40%, with a slight reduction on 2019-20 (39%).
- Data for total SCFF points by student registration status (i.e., whether the student was registered at the District any term of the academic year the student received the award) in Table 5.3 show that, on average, the FHDA CCD have been losing about 6% of SCFF student success points given the number of students receiving the award when they no longer attended any of the colleges at the District.














