## Introduction

The 2020-21 MIS SP (Student Academic Programs) report for the FHDA CCD (Foothill-De Anza Community College District) was submitted to the CCCCO (California Community colleges Chancellor's Office) on September 16, 2021. This document summarizes the data submitted in MIS SP for the last three academic years (2018-19, 2019-20 and 2020-21)<sup>1</sup> and provides data custodians across the District with the opportunity to identify issues that may undermine the validity of the data and address these prior to the next data submission.

The following is a general description of the sections in this document.

- *Data Validity Issues*: Identify records modified or deleted from the submission.
- *Data Highlights*: Identifies major, or unexpected findings, based on data shown in tables and figures in this document.
- *Tables and Figures*: Show academic award counts and student headcounts disaggregated by college, award type and academic year. Three methods are used to analyze the data shown in these tables:
  - All academic awards: Data include all academic award types received by any student at the college during the academic year as reported in MIS SP.
  - Highest academic award: Data only include the highest academic award type received by each student at the college during the academic year.
  - SCFF metric: Data only include the highest academic award type applicable to SCFF funding received by each student who was

registered at any college in the District during the academic year they received the award.<sup>2</sup>

### Data Validity Issues

- De Anza

    - DA\_CEA\_2CNC: Updated MIS code to N.
    - DA\_AS\_2CAD: Updated TOP code to 095340.
  - For Transfer Studies - IGETC/CSU, 9 duplicated records were deleted from the 2020-21 submission (duplicated: multiple student records with same top and unique code).

    - FH\_AS\_1FTV: Updated TOP code to 060420.

## Data Highlights

### *Academic Award Counts and Related Student Headcounts*

Table D1 and Table F1 show the number of awards and student headcount for each academic award type (associate degree for transfer, associate degree, credit certificate of at least 24 units or SCFF applicable, credit certificate of less than 24 units or not SCFF applicable, and noncredit certificate) for the last three academic years (2018-19, 2019-20, 2020-21) for De Anza College and Foothill College, respectively. Headcounts in these tables are not mutually exclusive.

De Anza College data in Table D1 show a significant increase in the student headcount within the last two academic years for most academic award types. The data show that the number of students who were awarded at least one degree for Transfer increased to 1,166 in 2020-21 from 857 in 2019-20 (36% increase). The student headcount for credit certificates of at least 24 units (SCFF funding applicable) increased to 484 in 2020-21 from 321 in 2019-20 (51% increase). Data in this table also show that degrees (degree for transfer or associate degrees) accounted for 72% of all awards at De Anza in 2020-21.

Foothill College data in Table F1 show a significant increase in the student headcount within the last two academic years for most credit awards. The largest increase was for credit certificates of less than 24 units (not applicable to SCFF funding): 146 in 2020-21 from 41 in 2019-20 (256% increase). The headcount for the *Dental Hygiene Baccalaureate* program increased to 72 in 2020-21 from 61 in 2019-20 (18% increase). Data in this table also show that degrees (baccalaureate, degree for transfer, associate degree) accounted for 54% of all awards at Foothill in 2020-21.

In Figure D1, De Anza data for the last three academic years show the degree award types with consistently higher headcounts when compared to that for certificates (more than double). On the other hand, Foothill data in Figure F1 consistently show certificates of at least 24 units as the award type with the highest headcount during the last three academic years.

### *Highest Academic Award: Academic Award Count and Related Student Headcount*

Data in Table D2 and Table F2 show statistics by highest academic award for the last three academic years for De Anza and Foothill, respectively (i.e., highest academic award type for each student at the college in the academic year). Notice that in these tables award counts are equal to student headcounts, and headcounts are mutually exclusive. For the data shown in these tables, awards were ranked from highest to lowest as follows: baccalaureate, associate degree for transfer, associate degree, credit certificate of at least 24 units (SCFF applicable), credit certificate of less than 24 units (SCFF not applicable), and noncredit certificate.

Data for De Anza in Table D2 show that between 2018-19 and 2020-21 about 80% of all students who received at least one academic award during the academic year were awarded at least one degree (degree for transfer or associate degree). At Foothill, the percentage of students with a degree as the highest academic award dropped to 73% in 2020-21 from 80% in 2019-20. Foothill data also show an 8% increase in the number of students with a credit certificate as the highest award during the period.

Regarding De Anza, Figure D2 shows that in 2020-21 the associate degree for transfer became the most common highest academic award, surpassing the headcount for associate degrees by 32% (281 more) during this academic year. This figure also shows that during the last three academic years there was a steady increase in the headcount for certificates of at least 24 units in the highest academic award category (52% between 2018-19 and 2020-21) and a relative decline for certificates of less than 24 units during the same period (15% drop between 2018-19 and 2020-21).

Figure F2 shows that at Foothill the associate degree for transfer has been the most common highest award during the last three academic years. This figure also shows that in 2019-20 there was an unexpected decline in the headcount for certificates of at least 24 units when compared to the headcount for the previous and next academic year—a drop of 28% from the previous year followed by an increase of 47% in the last year. Credit certificates of less than 24 units show an unexpected

increase in 2020-21, compared to previous academic years (e.g., an increase of 300% and 229% in 2019-20 and 2020-21, respectively).

### *SCFF Student Headcounts*

Data in Table D3 and Table F3 show headcounts based on SCFF Student Success metrics for all students, independently of financial aid status, related to academic awards.<sup>3</sup> Data in these tables only include: (1) degrees and certificates of at least 24 units, (2) the student's highest academic award during the academic year based on SCFF procedures, and (3) students registered by census date in at least one course during the academic year (i.e., included in at least one record in the MIS SX quarterly reports for the academic year). The SCFF procedures rank academic awards from highest to lowest as follows: degree for transfer, associate degree, baccalaureate, and credit certificate of at least 24 units. Although SCFF procedures relate to the student status at the district level (i.e., highest academic award at the district), for research purposes data in these tables are disaggregated by college (i.e., highest academic award at the college).

Data for De Anza in Table D3 show that 95% of all students who received at least one academic award applicable to SCFF funding in 2020-21 were enrolled during this academic year, which makes the record itself applicable to SCFF funding. When disaggregated by academic award type, the data show the highest percentage of student enrolled during the academic year they received the award for degrees for transfer (98%) and the lowest for credit certificates (90%).

For Foothill College, data in Table F2 show that 90% of all students who received at least one academic award applicable to SCFF funding in 2020-21 were enrolled during this academic year, compared to 92% and 93% in 2019-20 and 2018-20, respectively. By academic award type, 2020-21 data in this table show the baccalaureate degree with the highest percentage (97%) of students enrolled during the academic year they received the award and credit certificates with the lowest (72%).

### *SCFF Points Related to Academic Awards, All Students*

Data in Table D4 and F4 show SCFF points allocated based on applicable data (i.e., highest applicable academic award, registration status for the academic year). SCFF procedures allocate points by academic award as follows: degree for transfer, 4; associate or baccalaureate degree, 3; and credit certificate of at least 24 units, 2.

Data for De Anza in Table D4 show 7,475 SCFF points in 2020-21 for all academic awards, an increase of 28% over the previous academic year. As a percentage of the total, the data show that degrees for transfer accounted for about 61% of all points in 2020-21, while credit certificates only accounted for 6% in the same year.

Data for Foothill in Table F4 show 4,181 SCFF points in 2020-21, an increase of 9% over the prior academic year. By academic year, the data show that degrees for transfer accounted for 59% of all SCFF points in 2020-21, while credit certificates accounted for 11% in the same year.

Figure D3 show the extent to which degrees for transfer have increased their share of SCFF points at De Anza between 2018-19 and 2020-21 (49% to 61%). For Foothill, Figure F3 shows no significant differences by academic award regarding their share of SCFF points during the last three academic years, besides a drop in the share for credit certificates in 2019-20.

At the district level, FHDA CCD data in Table FHDA 1 show a total of 11,656 SCFF points in 2020-21, an increase of 21% over the prior academic year. Data in this table also show that 60% of all SCFF points in 2020-21 were accounted by degrees for transfer, compared to 43% in 2018-19 (an increase of 17 percentage points).

Data in Table FHDA 2 show percentage of total SCFF points by college, academic award, and academic year; and related three-year percentage average. These statistics represent the share of each college in the total number of SCFF points allocated to the District based on academic award data, all students included, from 2018-19 to 2020-21. Data in this table show that, on average, De Anza has accounted for 62% of all SCFF points under this SCFF metric during the last three

years. Foothill has accounted, on average, for about 38% of these points during the same period.

Figure FHDA 1 shows the percentage of total SCFF points by academic year for each college. This figure shows that in 2020-21 the share or percentage of total SCFF points for De Anza increased to 64% from 60% in prior years, while for Foothill the share of SCFF point dropped to 36%, from 40% during the the same period.

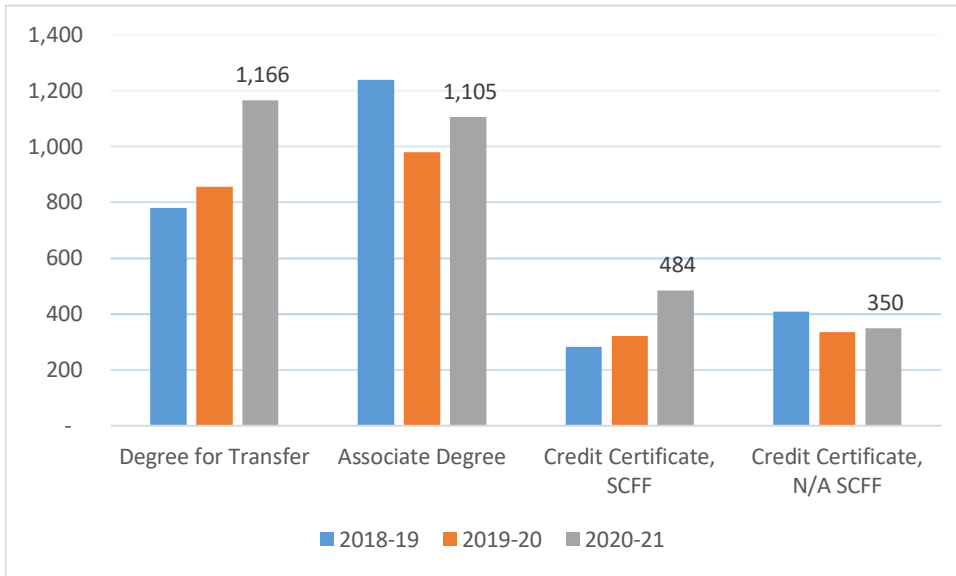

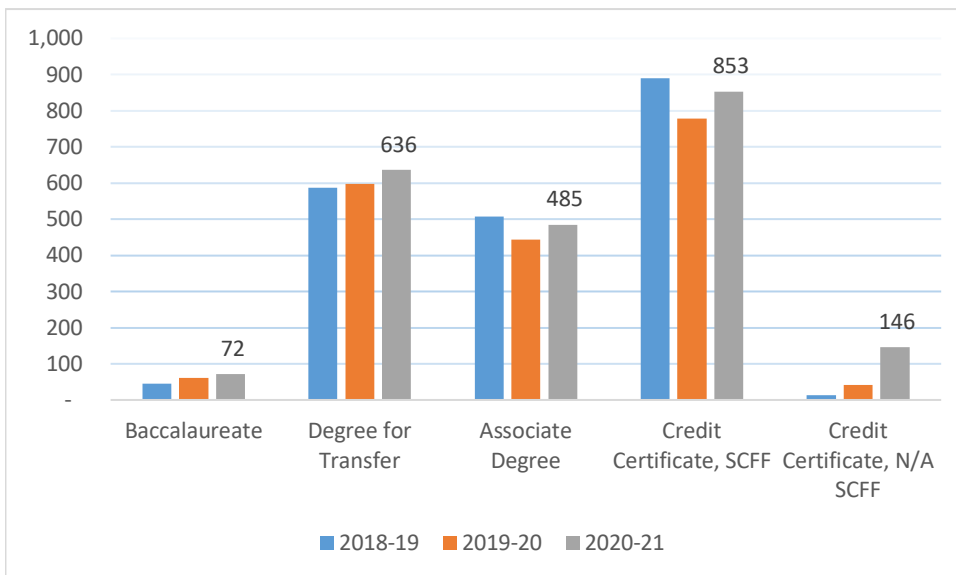

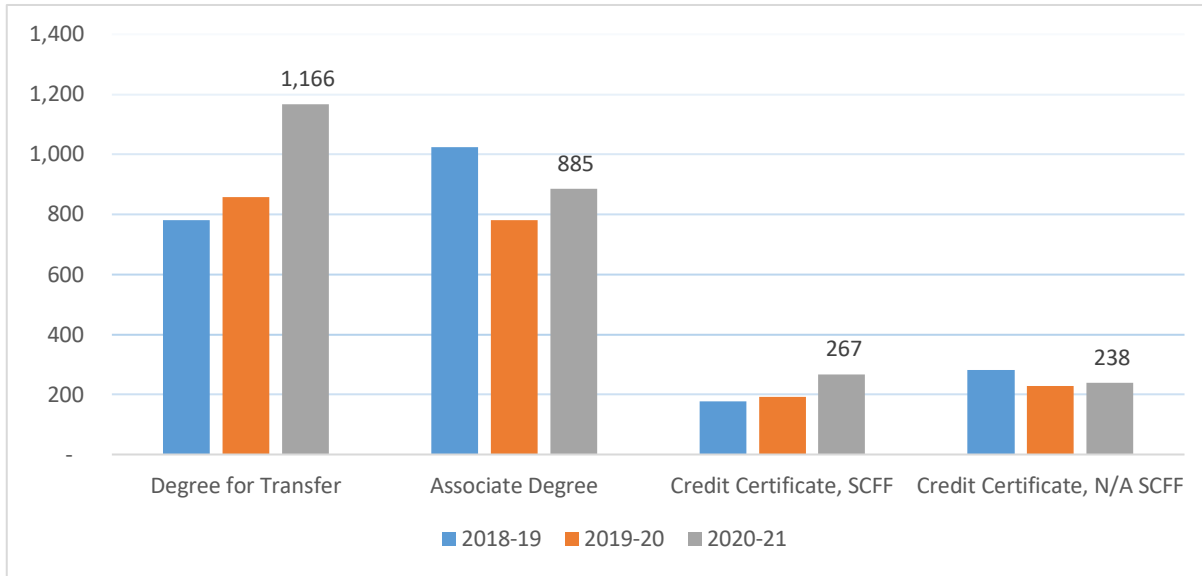

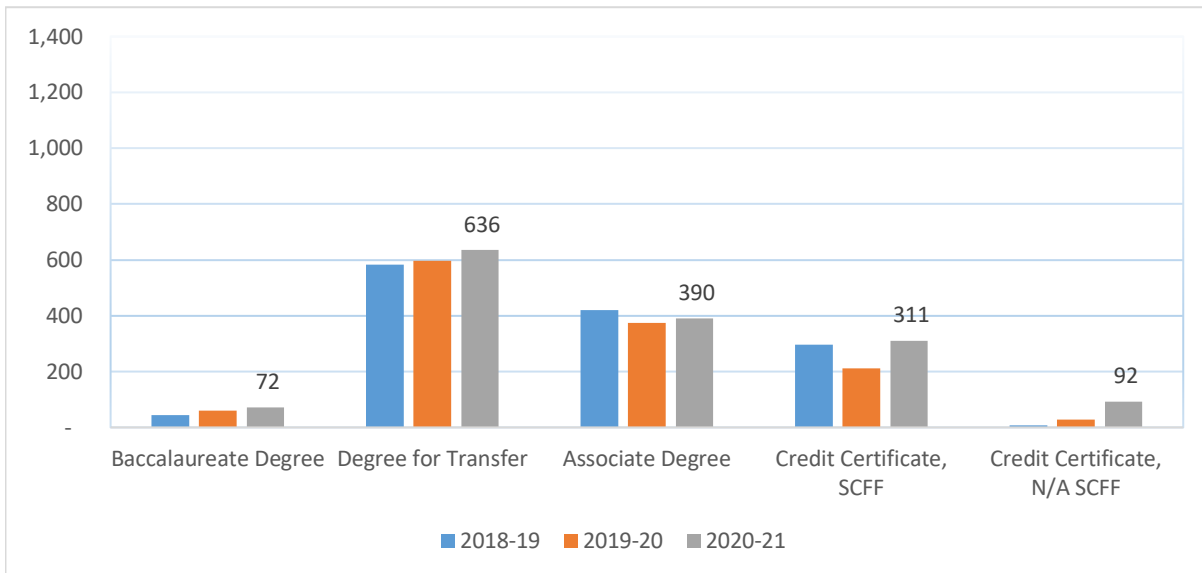

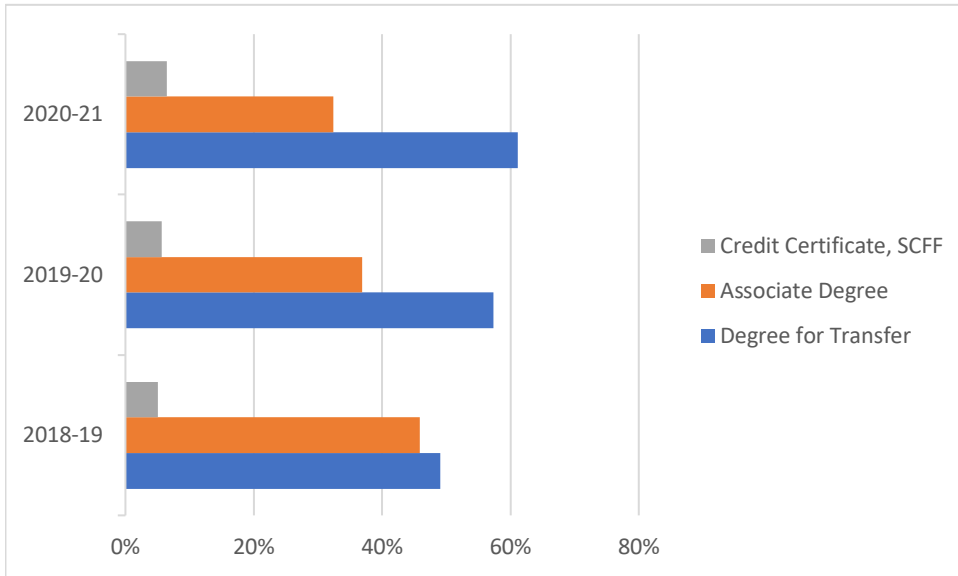

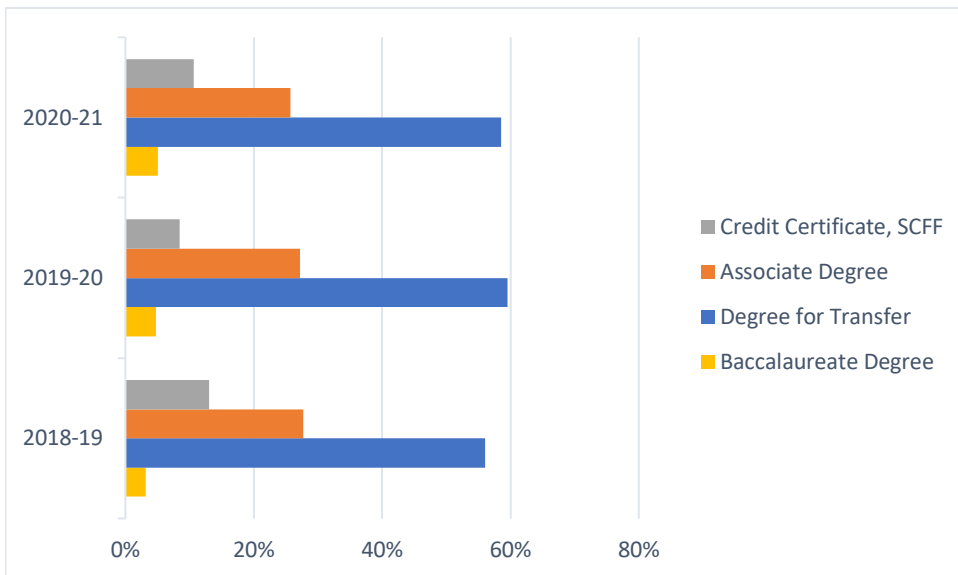

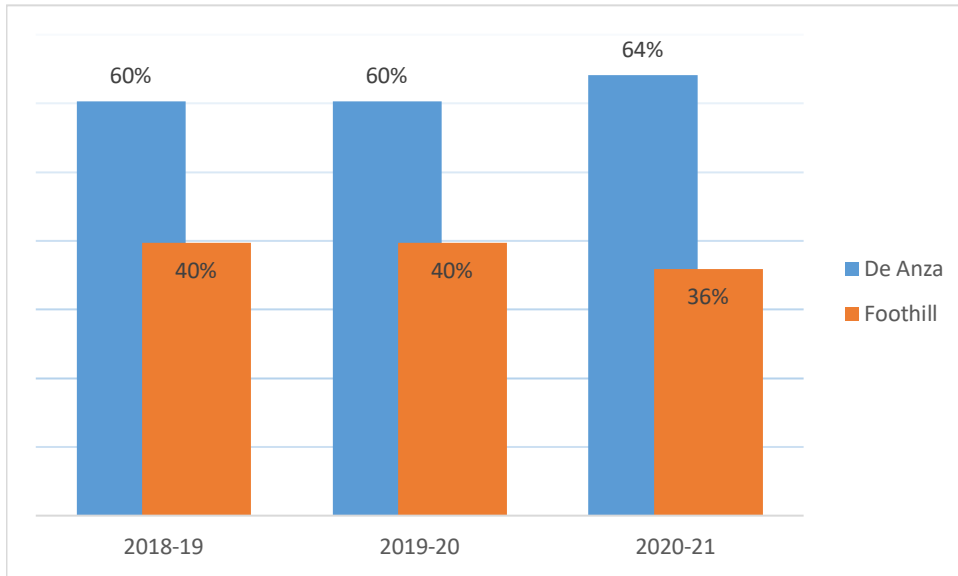
