- Re: Statistics for Transfer Studies Certificates at Foothill College

This document provides descriptive statistics for certificates of achievement in Transfer Studies awarded at Foothill College between 2011-12 and 2014-15. The certificates or programs include the CSU GE/Breadth (California State University General Education) and the IGETC UC/CSU (Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum, University of California or California State University). Once students have completed all requirements, the certificates are noted in their official transcripts to document completion of all lower division general education units as required by both the CSU and UC.¹

Figures in Table 1 show that 1,606 students received at least one of the transfer studies certificates of achievement at Foothill College between the academic years of 2011-12 and 2014-15. Figures by certificate or program show that 81% of these students earned an IGETC-UC certificate, as shown in Table 2. IGETC-UC headcount figures in Table 3 show a steady increase of about 5% during the last two years; and for the last academic year, IGETC-CSU figures show an increase of 60% increase. However, IGETC-CSU only accounts for 5% of all transfer studies certificates. In Table 3, figures show a significant decline for all certificates between 2011-12 and 2012-13, but this may be related to data migration issues during the implementation of the new information system.

Statistics for student demographics (gender, age, race/ethnic group) are shown in Table 4 to Table 9, including related statistics for the college student population in fall 2014, as shown at

the MIS Data Mart.² Gender statistics in Table 4 show that females are significantly more likely to earn a transfer studies certificate than males, in particular IGETC-CSU. Figures in Table 5 show that most students who earn these certificates tend to be about 20 years old and are significantly younger that the rest of the college student population, as shown in Table 6, especially for the IGETC-UC program.

Race/Ethnic group statistics are shown in Table 7 to Table 9, including figures for F-1 visa students. One of the key findings shown in these figures is the overrepresentation of F-1 visa students among those who earned IGETC certificates. For example, figures in Table 8 show that even when F-1 visa students make up about 8% of the Foothill College student population, these students account for more than 40% of those who earned an IGETC-UC certificate. In Table 7 and 9, figures show a major contrast between Asian and Hispanic students: Asians are more likely to earn an IGETC-UC (percentage figure 50% higher than expected, 36% from 22%), while Hispanics are significantly less likely to earn this certificate (percentage figure less than half of expected figure, 10% from 24%).
