Re: Descriptive statistics for Transfer Studies certificates at Foothill College awarded during the

2015-16 academic year

Introduction

This document provides descriptive statistics for certificates of achievement in Transfer Studies awarded at Foothill College in the 2016 (2015-16) academic year and compare results with those for 2012 (2011-12). The certificates or programs of studies include the CSU GE/Breadth (California State University General Education) and the IGETC UC/CSU (Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum, University of California or California State University). The certificates are noted in the students' transcripts to document completion of all lower division general education units as required by both the CSU and UC. ¹

Results

Statistics in Table 1 show that a total of 417 students earned a transfer certificate in the academic year of 2016 at Foothill College, a decline of 6% when compared to the number for 2012 (442). Among the three programs, the IGETC UC certificate has consistently accounted for most of the student headcount (about 80%) during the last five academic years, as shown in Figure 1. The CSU GE Breadth is the only certificate showing in decline (50% or 78 to 39) between 2012 and 2016.

For gender, statistics in Table 2 and Figure 2 show a 17% decline in the number of women who earned a transfer certificate between the academic years of 2012 and 2016 (240 to 199); for men, the data show an increase of 7% (202 to 217) for the same period. Gender statistics for the college student population in Table 2 for 2012 and 2016 also show a decline of 3% (7,126 to 6,943) in the number of women who enrolled in the spring terms at Foothill College, compared to an increase of 12% (6,284 to 7,015) for the number of men enrolled for the same period at this college.

Age statistics in Table 3 show no changes in the median age (midpoint of the age distribution) for students who earned transfer certificates in 2012 and 2016: data for these two academic years show that students in the IGETC UC were on average younger (median age 20), while those in the CSU GE Breadth were on average older (median age 23). When comparing age statistics for the transfer certificate groups with those for the college student population, figures by age group in Table 4 and Figure 3 show that students who earned the transfer certificates were likely to be significantly younger when compared to the rest of the college population. For instance, about 93% of students who earned the IGETC UC in 2016 were 24 years old or younger, compared to 61% for the college student population for the spring term of the same academic year. The statistics also show that the college student population has become, on average, younger: 53% of the Foothill College students in spring 2012 were 24 years old or younger, compared to 61% in spring 2016.

When taking into account race/ethnic group and citizenship status, statistics show that a large percentage of students who earned transfer certificates at Foothill College tend to be foreign or international students. For instance, statistics in Table 5 show that 47% (168 of 356) of the students who earned an IGETC UC certificate in 2016 were foreign students. In 2012, foreign students made up 41% (142 of 345) of the IGETC UC certificate earners.

Regarding significant changes related to race/ethnicity or citizenship status between 2012 and 2016, data for the CSU GE/Breadth certificate show a decline of 55% (22 to 10) for Hispanics and 71% for Whites (34 to 10) between these academic years. For the IGETC UC certificate, the data show an increase of 17% (18 to 21) for Hispanics and 11% (73 to 81) for Asians, while for Whites the data show a decline of 24% (89 to 68) for this period. The percentage increases or declines between 2012 and 2016 for these groups reflect to some degree changes in the college student population demographics for these academic years. During these last five academic years, the number of foreign, Asian, and Hispanic students at Foothill College has increased by 12%, 18%, and 32%, respectively, while the number of White students has declined by 12%.

Figure 1. Student Headcount by Transfer Certificate and Academic Year









